

## Accessibility Check List

The Kentucky Arts Council believes that arts programs and services should be accessible to all people of the Commonwealth. Cultural programs must be fully accessible to and inclusive of every individual, including citizens with disabilities and older adults.

Check the accessibility services provided by the facility/facilities that you own or rent. Services and accommodations must be based on the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design.

### For Persons with Mobility Disabilities:

Appropriate number of accessible parking spaces with at least one van parking space

Accessible-height drinking fountains

Accessible route from parking area to the entrance

Accessible-height mirrors in restrooms

Wheelchair-compatible outdoor surfaces (i.e., even, non-grass surface)

Accessible-height paper towel/dryers in restrooms

Facility doors that can be opened without twisting or grasping, using only five pounds of pressure or less

Accessible-height sinks in restrooms

Access to all building areas - including entrance - without use of stairs

Appropriate number of accessible seats free of sight-line barriers

Sufficient doorway widths (32" minimum) including bathroom stalls

Appropriate service counter height

Wheelchair-compatible indoor carpet and mats (less than half-inch and secured to the floor)

ADA-compliant ticketing policies

Signage regarding accessible entrances, exits and restrooms

Accessible dressing rooms for performers

Grab bars in restrooms at appropriate heights

Accessible stage for performers

### For Persons with Visual Disabilities:

Braille signage on restroom doors at appropriate height

Readily available large-print materials

Braille signage on elevator controls at appropriate height

Audio description

Braille room name/numbers at appropriate height

Recorded audio text

Braille exit signs at appropriate height

Touch tours

### For Persons with Hearing and/or Speech Disabilities:

Assistive listening system (preferably T-coil-compatible)

American Sign Language interpretation

Captioning and/or CART (computer-assisted real time translation)

Effective communications (e.g., TTY, email, etc.)

**Other Accommodations:**

Notice in publicity materials of availability of access services (e.g., sign language interpretation, audio description, captioning, etc.)

Regular training for staff concerning persons with disabilities

Regular training for volunteers concerning persons with disabilities

Regular training for board concerning persons with disabilities
