Accessible Parking

Parking accommodations for guests with disabilities are available in the Kentucky Horse Park parking lots and labeled with signage.

Information Desk

The information desk is located near the front doors of the Alltech Arena. For questions about the facilities, the show, or Market exhibitors, please talk with staff at the information desk.

Accessibility Services

A limited number of wheelchairs are available at the information desk. An American Sign Language interpreter will be on the Market Stage during performances. All restrooms on the grounds are wheelchair accessible, and ramps give access to all buildings.

Food Service

The concessions stations are located at the front of the exhibit hall, along with food trucks on the arena floor. Both will be open during show hours. There are several restaurants in Lexington and Georgetown located within driving distance of the Kentucky Horse Park. See the information desk for recommendations.

Recycling

The Folklife Zone



A thriving music community must have skilled musicians, music teachers, creative writers and composers, and great-sounding instruments. The last ingredient, especially stringed instruments, is made possible by luthiers, who specialize in making, repairing and setting up guitars, banjos, violins, mandolins and more.

This year's Folklife Zone features guitar maker **Glespie Ray Deweese**, winner of the 2019 Homer Ledford Award, who will share some of his instruments, tools and processes with visitors. Deweese grew up in Butler County, where he learned woodworking from his neighbor, celebrated Kentucky long rifle maker Hershel House. Deweese is known for building traditional, jumbo, dreadnought, and 000 Martin style acoustic guitars, but his works also include electric six-string and bass guitars. In addition to crafting guitars, Deweese is skilled at performing standard maintenance and repairs, including neck and bridge adjustments, refinishing, and fret work on a variety of stringed instruments.

Folklorists from the Kentucky Folklife Program and Folk Studies at Western Kentucky University will introduce visitors to Ray Deweese and share stories



from the **Sonic Landscape** exhibit on display now at the Kentucky Museum in Bowling Green, which includes Deweese and many more music makers and supporters that make south-central Kentucky an amazing musical region.

At the crossroads of north and south, east and west, south-central Kentucky has long been a hub for musical expression and exchange. Whether raised here or just passing through, musicians gravitate to Bowling Green and its surrounding region. Their journeys have resulted in some of popular music's greatest innovations and sounds, from early jazz to newgrass to country-rap. Sonic Landscape tells their story, in their own words, for the first time.

Yes Arts

Join Yes Arts for a communal needle felting experience on a sign that will say, "Kentucky Crafted," and an opportunity to make a corn husk doll.

Yes Arts provides a robust youth prevention program known as YAY (Yes Arts Youth). YAY Program Leaders and Youth Mentors are trained on trauma-informed care, implicit bias, neurodiversity, child abuse, and ACES (Adverse Childhood Experiences) risk and protective factors. YAY exists to create a safe, inclusive space for children of all ages and abilities to find strong mentors, lasting friendships and quality arts instruction to reduce the risk of falling into the cycle of addiction and to mitigate harm due to generational trauma. Additionally, Yes Arts offers community programs: a professional gallery featuring the work of local and regional artists, outreach programs for community engagement and a roster of more than 75 teaching artists. We offer therapeutic arts services through our ART (Achieving Recovery Together) Program, for people in recovery from substance use disorder in partnership with the Franklin County Drug Court and other local nonprofit partners. All programs follow evidence-based, data-driven practices and work within all stages of the cycle of addiction, from primary prevention to recovery.



Kentucky Historical Society

The Kentucky Historical Society (KHS) was formed in 1836 by a group of prominent Kentuckians intent on preserving the history of the commonwealth. We are a membership organization with members from Kentucky and around the world. We are part of the Kentucky Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet; have full American Alliance of Museums accreditation; are a Smithsonian affiliate; and endorse the History Relevance statement. We educate and engage the public through Kentucky's history in order to meet the challenges of the future.

As the State Children's Theatre of Kentucky, LCT can tour productions to people all over the state and reach more than 60,000 Kentuckians a year through all these programs.

The Living Arts and Science Center programs are hands-on and interactive instruction in arts and science directly from professional educators and active artists and scientists. The LASC also offers education tailored to special needs, at-risk and underserved children and adults. The staff and board of directors support this mission by maintaining high ethical standards and efficient oversight of the LASC.

Appalachia to the Andes is a four-member band of Appalachian and Latino artists that performs traditional and original music from their folk opera Cornbread and Tortillas, which is itself a storied journey of music and dance that explores the common ground between Appalachian, Southern, and various Latinx cultures.



Individual Artist Fellowships are given to Kentucky artists who have achieved a high level of excellence and creativity in their work.

Emerging Artist Awards are for early-career, professional Kentucky artists who demonstrate excellence and creativity in their work.

Folk and Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Grants honor traditional artists and encourage the continuation of Kentucky's living traditional arts by funding mentor artists to teach skills and practices vital to their cultural heritage to less experienced artists within their disciplines.

Kentucky Crafted is an adjudicated program that assists Kentucky visual and craft artists through marketing and promotional opportunities and arts business training. Artists in this program are included in the Kentucky Crafted directory and are eligible to exhibit at The Kentucky Crafted Market.

The Performing Artists Directory is an adjudicated program that promotes, showcases, and provides professional development opportunities to a diverse selection of Kentucky's finest contemporary and traditional performing artists.

The **Kentucky Poet Laureate** is appointed by the governor for a two-year term based on nominations collected by the Kentucky Arts Council and is expected to travel the state promoting the literary arts at meetings, seminars and conferences.

GRANTS & PROGRAMS

The **Kentucky Arts Partnership Grant** Program provides unrestricted operating support to arts organizations to ensure that year-round participation in the arts is available to Kentuckians.

The **Kentucky Touring Grant** is a matching grant that helps make quality public performances available to Kentuckians. This program supports presenters to book performers of dance, music, theater, and storytelling from the Performing Artists Directory.

The **Arts Miles Directory** makes high-quality artistic field trips accessible by connecting arts organizations with preK-12 schools.

The **Kentucky Peer Advisory Network** consists of arts professionals on the Kentucky Peer Advisory directory available to provide six-hour consultancies, paid by the arts council, to assist eligible organizations and individual artists with board development, grant writing, marketing and promotions, strategic planning, festival planning and other activities.

GRANTS & PROGRAMS

The **Arts Miles Program** enables Kentucky teachers and schools to offer students high-quality arts experiences by providing transportation funding for school field trips.

The **Teaching Art Together Grant** supports teachers collaborating with professional artists on the design and implementation of innovative one-week residencies. Residencies provide teachers with tools to continue to incorporate the arts into the curriculum after the residency is complete.

The **Community Scholars Program** trains members of a community in documentation, interpretation and dissemination of their unique local cultural resources and traditional art forms.
